

# From the Executive Director



In October of 2017, The Common Place (TCP) celebrated its 4th year of serving children and families of Southwest Philadelphia. We continue to be blessed with growing community participation in our programs, worship, services, partnerships and facility usage. TCP is open every day of the week and on any given day one might see parenting classes held by Turning Points for Children; our Common Place Scholars After School Enrichment program; classes and meetings held by neighboring Cornerstone Christian Academy; high school diploma training classes held by Faith Connections Christian Academy; sessions of the SPOT children's ministry, along with the S.W. Philly Children's Choir; City Lights events and many other programs. We focus our programing efforts on providing education, social service, collaboration and faith formation for children and families of the community.

As we approach our fifth year of service, we continually assess community needs while strategically evaluating if and how TCP can address them. Some of the major needs identified are: health services, education, nutrition and housing assistance. We have taken some steps to fill these needs. Our Common Place Scholars After School Enrichment program is now providing technical education to students through the provision of tablet computers and plan to add laptops in 2018. Students will have opportunities to learn graphic arts, coding and music production. We will be partnering with Health Partners, Inc. to provide health education and screenings. Once our kitchen is renovated, the existing nutrition education program will be greatly enhanced to enable us to better reach out into the community. We are also in conversations with organizations that provide housing assistance to help fill this need in our neighborhood. Now that we have established our presence, there are many ways in which TCP can reach beyond our blue doors in collaboration, to positively impact our community.

During conception, one of the underlying benefits to be realized in TCP's development was not only the provision of services to the community, but also through providing opportunities for those outside of the SW Philadelphia community. For this reason, we have developed A Common Mission Experience. This week long, residential program involves youth in urban service, fellowship, fun and worship. We have identified and developed relationships with a select group of partners through which our guests will have an opportunity to serve and learn.

Our 100 + year old building keeps us busy with upkeep, but TCP continues to improve. TCP has risen from an empty building to a thriving focal point of our community. Due to generous contributions, we had a new concrete floor poured and beautiful floor tiles installed. Our kitchen plans are in the approval process with the City of Philadelphia and once we have renovated this kitchen and made associated improvements to our infrastructure, TCP will have completed its major renovation goals.

As we look toward the future, we continue to be amazed and thankful for God's faithfulness to TCP. He has continuously blessed this organization in many ways. Many thanks to our growing constituency of supporters and please continue with your support and prayers.

# **Programs/Partners**

**A Common Mission Experience** is a 6 week, service-oriented empowerment program that provides an opportunity for groups of all faiths and religious backgrounds to learn and work alongside one another within the Southwest Philadelphia community.



**CityLights** is a faith-based nonprofit that makes its home in The Common Place. The Network links organizations and grassroots groups in Southwest Philadelphia to each other and to outside resource partners in order to strengthen the neighborhood and positively impact residents.



**Cornerstone Christian Academy** is a private independent school that has served Southwest Philadelphia since 1988. Cornerstone's Development Offices are located on the second floor of the space while school events such as chapel, luncheons, and meetings occur on the lower level.



**Faith Connection Christian Academy** is a private Christian school that makes it home in The Common Place. The academy gives students an opportunity to earn a high school diploma when other doors have been closed.



**New Spirit Community Church** is a family-centered church community led by Rev. Christopher J. Holland II. Bible Studies are Tuesday evenings at 7pm, Sunday school is 10 am, and Sunday morning worship services are 11 am in the Sanctuary.



**St. David's Center for Spiritual Direction** offers both individual and group Spiritual Direction session at The Common Place. Three times a year, the Center offers "Morning of Holy Rest" gatherings for women in the Southwest Philadelphia community.

**The Common Place Scholar After-school Enrichment Program** is an after-school arts and enrichment program that serves students of the Southwest Philadelphia community.

**The Common Worship Experience** is a "kid-led, pastor approved" worship service one Sunday a quarter at 5:00 pm. Worship is youth-oriented and family-friendly; our Youth Leadership Team joins Rev. Christopher Holland and the house band in leading worship. Our free dinner, the Common Meal, is a family oriented community feeding that follows service at 6:30 pm.








